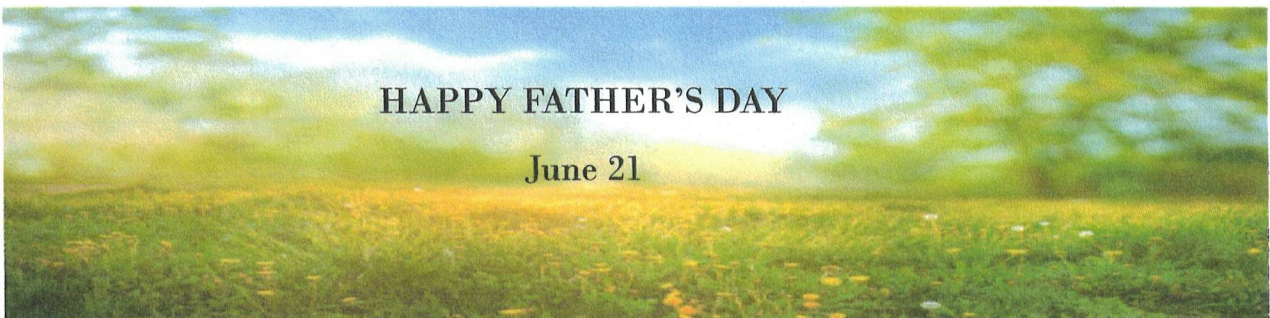
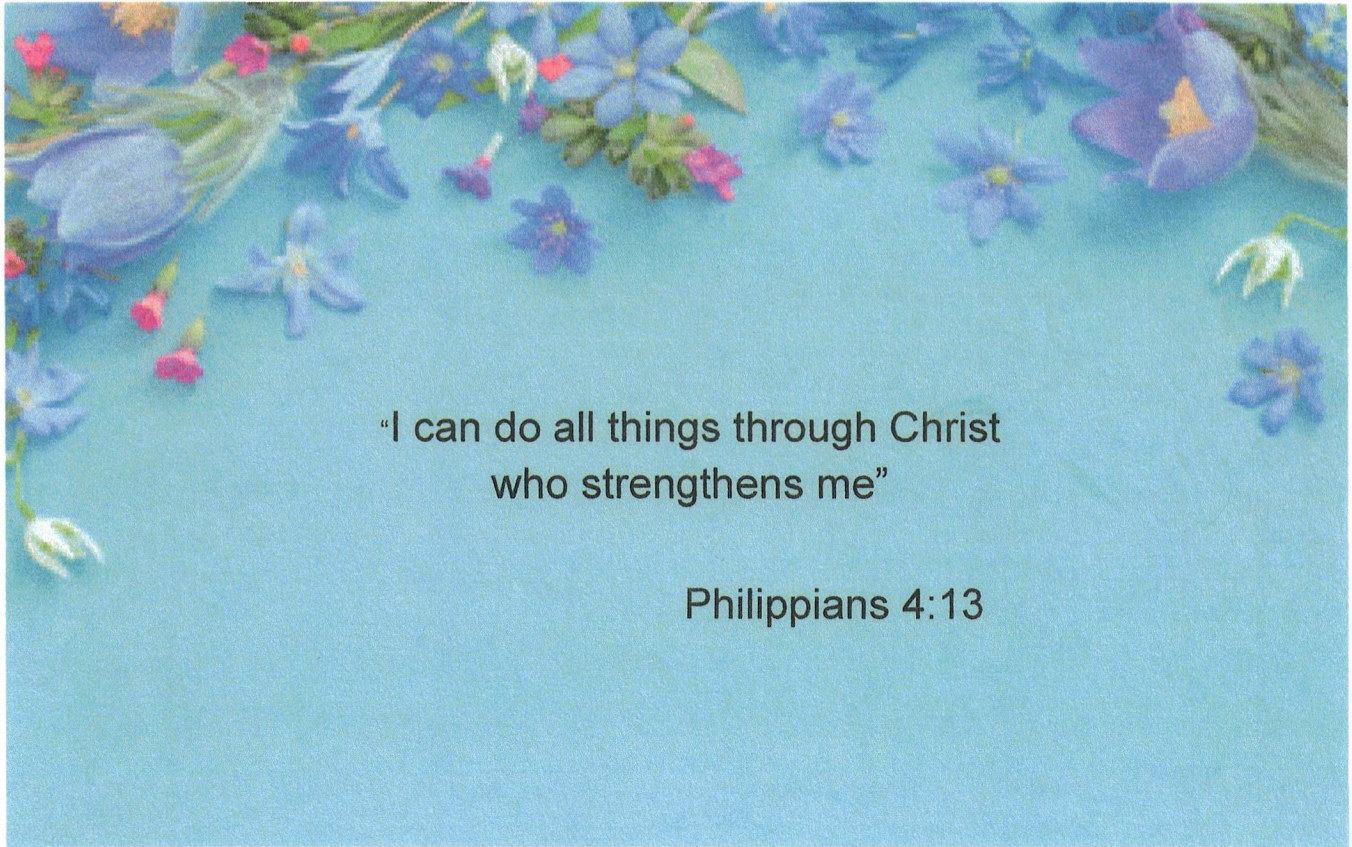

The Neiman Marcus Cookie

Full Batch:

2 cups
 4 cups
 2 tsp.
 2 cups
 5 cups
 24 oz.
 2 cups
 1 tsp.
 8 oz.
 4 lg.
 2 tsp.
 2 tsp.
 3 cups

Half Batch:

1 cup Butter
 2 cups Flour
 1 tsp. Baking Soda
 1 cup Sugar
 2.5 cups Blended oatmeal (fine powder)
 12 oz. Chocolate chips
 1 cup Brown Sugar
 ½ tsp. Salt
 4 oz. Grated Hershey bar
 2 lg. Eggs
 1 tsp. Baking powder
 1 tsp. Vanilla
 1.5 cups Chopped nuts

Cream the butter and both sugars. Add eggs and vanilla; mix together with flour, oatmeal, salt, baking powder, and baking soda. Add chocolate chips, chocolate bar and nuts. Roll into balls and place 2" apart on a cookie sheet.

Bake for 10 minutes at 375 degrees.

Full batch makes 112 cookies, half batch makes 56 cookies!
